## **Course Outline - Leadership 11 - 2020-2021**

This is a 4 credit course designed for students who would like to develop their leadership skills, self-awareness in their interactions with others and project design and management. Through this course you will also have the opportunity to learn about leadership opportunities in our school and local community.

## **Course Components**

- **Retreat** – All Leadership 11 students will attend a mandatory retreat that will take place in September. Date and location tba. This retreat will allow you to meet your classmates, learn about your specific leadership style, and begin planning your Passion Project.
- **Seminars** – In the seminars you will learn about different leadership styles and theories as well as build interpersonal skills. These seminars will be taught by Collingwood teachers and experts from our local community. Attendance is mandatory and seminars take place approximately once a month. Dates are listed below.
- **Fortnightly Classes** – Roughly every two weeks there is a mandatory class at lunch (day of the week and room tba). These classes will cover discussion materials, mini-assignments and opportunities to meet with your coach to discuss your passion project.
- **Expedition** – You will commit to your expedition when accepted into the course for either the Tall ships experience or the canoe trip. The expedition will focus on aspects of leadership not able to be taught in a seminar setting. Active and self-leadership, group dynamics, expedition behaviour and feedback are skills that will be developed. The expedition is a mandatory component of the course.
- **Passion Project/Choose Your Leadership** – This personal leadership experience enables you to choose and develop an area that you are passionate about. Over the course of the year you will develop a project and implement it. This project will showcase your interests and development of your personal leadership journey. You will have the opportunity to meet with your Leadership 11 coach to help

troubleshoot and guidance throughout the year. There are several components to this project and it culminates with a presentation of learning at the end of the year.
