



Leadership 11 Application Registration & Application due May 7th, 2018

What is Leadership 11?

Leadership 11 is a 4-credit Collingwood course taught by Mr. Field, Mr. Waters, Ms. Paul and Mr. Pool. It combines classroom theory, interactive activities, experiential “learning by doing” and online collaboration. It is our hope that successful students will become leaders and more engaged within the school community. Students will develop confidence and self-awareness in leadership situations, develop people skills, as well as learn insights as to how people are motivated in positive ways. The course is designed for students who are independent and self-motivated learners.

Who can apply for Leadership 11?

Any Grade 10-11 student can apply. This is an “Extended Studies” course which means it is offered outside of the timetable so students are expected to be able to handle this commitment on top of their regular school commitments and their after school commitments. Ideally, students have previous Explore experience or equivalent.

When and where does Leadership 11 occur?

Leadership 11 must be completed in one year except in rare extenuating circumstances. See below for the details of each portion of the course.

A leadership teacher guides the reflection. * Choose Your Own Leadership will allow students to select various leadership experiences available in the school or community where they can practice applying their own philosophy on leadership.



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- **OVERNIGHT RETREAT TO LAUNCH COURSE – FRIDAY SEPT 7- SATURDAY SEPT 8:** (10%)

The course begins with an overnight retreat or Seminar #1 to the Cheakamus Center. The cost is covered when you register for the course. The trip leaves at approximately 1:30pm from Morven on Friday and will return around Noon on Saturday. This is a fun and interactive way to have our group bond and learn about the course. Attendance on this trip is mandatory.

- **EXPLORE EXPEDITION:** (35%)

The expedition is a **mandatory** component of the course. This activity is where you take skills from the course and apply what you've learned in a supportive group setting. You must **commit to set aside the time to go on the expedition and to pay a deposit for the trip up front** when you are accepted into the course (early April). For the Fall Tall Ships Expedition the **cost will be approximately \$1350** and for the Spring Canoeing Expedition will be approximately **\$700**. (*2018-19 costs for expeditions not set yet).

*Dates: If you are interested in the Fall Tall Ships Expedition the dates are Friday, Oct 19 – Tuesday Oct 23, 2018. The approximate Spring Expedition dates are June 17-22, 2019 immediately following June exams.

- **SEMINARS:** (30%)

All except Seminar #1, will be held on campus after school beginning at 3:20 pm and ending at 5pm if students are on time. They average once a month from September to May. Students will enjoy a variety of teaching styles from the different teachers. *You **must attend all seminars**. Because the class time is so limited, attendance is mandatory and is reflected in your mark as well as whether or not you pass the course.

- **CHOOSE YOUR OWN LEADERSHIP (CYL):** (25%)

25 hours of your choice in a leadership experience is to be completed. An assigned leadership teacher guides the process but it is you who is responsible for organizing and carrying out your leadership opportunities. As part of your CYL, you will set measurable goals, complete a learning log and reflect on your leadership journey.*Possible leadership options include:

- Round Square India or Belize Service Trips
- Leadership at a Round Square Conference
- Student Executive or House Captain
- Encounter Leader
- Cabin Leader for Grades 4, 5, or 6
- Hungry for Changes, Soup Kitchens, Habitat for Humanity, Backpack Buddies
- Outside of Collingwood events: SWAT, RAT, Youth HAT, YAC, Thunderbird Mentoring
- Coaching or volunteering off campus

- **PORTFOLIO:** (Included in the assessment of each component above)

The **seminar assignments are due three days before each class** to prepare for the topic. Students are required to post goals and reflections on their Portfolio's during the course. The portfolio provides a wonderful online platform where teachers can assign leadership work, provide feedback and support and where students submit their work. Often parts of the portfolio have been used in Grad transitions, university applications or even job applications!
